

God <u>reveals</u> himself by His <u>name</u> as "I AM WHO I AM" (Yahweh or Jehovah) which means the <u>self-proclaimed</u> one.

God's <u>mighty power</u> brought the new nation of Israel out of Egyptian <u>slavery</u> and into <u>freedom</u>.

Remember God's ultimate passion is to <u>restore</u> <u>relationship</u>!

- I. God gives guidelines for how we treat <u>God</u> and <u>each</u> <u>other</u>. (Exodus 20:1-7)
  - A. God wants a community of <u>love</u> that reflects the relationships of the Trinity.
  - B. The Ten Commandments shape the **community** of love.
  - C. Our sin nature **resists** God's guidelines.
- II. God <u>desires</u> a place to <u>dwell</u> among us. (Exodus 25)
  - A. God gave **specific** directions for the making of the **Tabernacle**. (Exodus 25:8-9)

- B. The Tabernacle was portable tent. God would **guide** his people with a **moving cloud** during the day and by a **column of fire** at night.
- III. God requires that **sin** be **atoned** for (covered) by shedding of **blood**.

Jesus is our great <u>High Priest</u> and his <u>blood</u> once and for all atones for (covers) our sin (Hebrews 10:1-18).

With the blood of Jesus on the **door post** of our **soul**, you are **forgiven** and given direct access into the **Most Holy Place**.

We are the **place** where God **dwells**. We are the new tabernacle.

The Great Commandment is the **guideline** Jesus **gives** to and **models** for us.

Matthew 22:38–40 "This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

John 13:35 "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
